## Drink Carpinteria Water Campaign Results!

Results from the "Drink Carpinteria Water" taste tests given to 111 people, either at the Farmers Market or at Von's on Linden Avenue, have yielded some predictable results. Better than half of the participants rated the unnamed bottled water better (see pie chart below). Taste, of course, is a very personal matter, and some people are extremely good at distinguishing the slightest taste and odor nuances. Some not. Some people also buy bottled water as a beverage.


What was welcome news to the Directors and staff that participated in the events was the number of comments about how Carpinteria's water has improved. This is to be expected in light of the major Safe Drinking Water capital improvements the District has recently completed including covering the very large open Ortega and Carpinteria Reservoirs. There is no longer any need to super-chlorinate these reservoirs to compensate for the exposure of finished treated water to

birds and wind-blown debris.

There was also a lot of discussion about the average cost of Carpinteria Valley Water District tap water compared to bottled water. A gallon of CVWD tap water costs only a penny compared to as much as \$2.50 or more for bottled waters.

The District continues to make improvements that will improve the quality of your drinking water, including a \$4 million contribution to the City of Santa Barbara for its introduction of an ozonation process at Santa Barbara's Cater Treatment Plant, through which all of the District's Cachuma water supply flows for treatment. And the District's largely grant funded El Carro Well and Pipeline Project now in progress will greatly increase the ability of the District to deliver more of its local high quality groundwater in conjunction with its Cachuma and back-up State Water supplies.

Benefits of the \$2 million project, partially funded by a Proposition 50 grant, include a centralized pressure zone and improved water quality. The work is expected to be completed by the end of the year.
