El Carro Well Project

The El Carro Well Project is nearly complete! This project funded partially by State grant funds will bring reliability to Carpinteria Valley Water Districts groundwater production operations. The new well, drilled in 2011, will produce upwards of 1500 gallons per minute and will help supply high quality local groundwater to CVWD customers. The well is one of two "high producing wells" owned by CVWD that will improve water quality and provide drought protection. The final elements of the project are being completed through December and the well is expected to go on line in January 2013.
